From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we once again kick off the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. We, as a parish, also benefit from this appeal since each year we receive a refund for meeting or exceeding our goal. This year Saint Mary's, because of the generosity and dedication of our parishioners, received almost \$4,000.00 back (3,807.50 to be exact). This year our goal is \$45,568.66. Our stretch goal is \$55,872.30. If we meet our stretch goal it will bring more back in reimbursement to Saint Mary's, but in either case meeting our goal brings a monetary reimbursement to our Church. Each year the Archbishops' Annual Appeal helps assist the many programs that the Catholic Archdiocese of Newark supports and runs. For example, Mt. Carmel Guild Academy, which serves the educational needs of children with learning disabilities; the three Archdiocesan Seminaries, one of which our former Pastor, Msgr. Hubba serves as Spiritual Director; Catholic Schools; the homeless and the poor. These are just a few of the many and varied services the Archdiocese provides for through your generosity and dedication.

In the readings this week we see the Glory of God in His Son Jesus Christ our Lord and God manifested in the healings and miracles proclaimed in the Gospel. Saint Mary's, as part of the Church in Newark and the Universal Church worldwide, is part of the continued ministry of Christ. Each year the Archbishop asks the faithful to be part of this mission by pledging our financial support that enables the Archbishop to continue the mission of Christ and his Church through the various offices that services the larger community as a whole. In our Baptism, the words "just as Christ was anointed as Priest, Prophet, and King so to are you anointed to His mission." Powerful words that commission us to continue Christ's mission in today's world. As I have previously stated, Saint Mary's Church has always responded tremendously to this appeal. I trust and pray we continue to do so and ask that you be as generous as possible in responding to the Archbishops request that we be part of "Come, Be My Light" for we are "Lumen Christi" "the light of Christ."

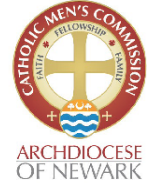

World Marriage Day

February 12, 2012



The idea of celebrating marriage began in Baton Rouge, La., in 1981, when couples encouraged the mayor, the governor and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentine's Day as "We Believe in Marriage Day". The event was so successful, the idea was presented to and adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter's national leadership.

By 1982, 43 Governors officially proclaimed the day and celebrations spread to U.S. military bases in several foreign countries. In 1983, the name was changed to "World Marriage Day", designed to be celebrated each year on the second Sunday in February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessings on World Marriage Day.

St. Mary's Parish will celebrate World Marriage Day this year. You are all invited to join us in our celebration. The 12 o'clock Mass on February 12 will be specially dedicated in honor of husband and wife as head of the family, the basic unit of society. We salute the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life.
