Reading I: Jonah 3: 1-5, 10


The prophet, as God's spokesman, brings about a miraculous turnaround by the people of Nineveh. Prior to that, the city was known only for its sinful cruelty and wickedness.

Reading II: I Corinthians 7: 29-31

St. Paul believed in an imminent end of the world, so he recommends detachment from earthly ways. It would be ridiculous to maintain one's "status quo" in such circumstances.

The Gospel: Mark 1: 14-20

Jesus calls His first disciples. He was so compelling that they were immediate with their responses. Jesus describes their new life's work as their becoming "fishers of men."

For Health and Safety

- ❖ Openly accessed areas of the Church are being cleaned daily.
- ❖ Appropriate cleaning of the Church is being done before and after each Mass.
- ❖ Holy Water fonts will remain empty until further notice
- ❖ Public Restroom access is restricted to emergency use due to state health mandates. If the restroom is utilized, please use the provided automatic soap and towel dispensers.

AS WE GATHER AGAIN TO ATTEND PUBLIC MASS, PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES

- ❖ Before coming to Mass, take your temperature at home. If you have a fever or are not feeling well, please stay home.
- ❖ Please remember to **WASH YOUR HANDS** for at least 20 seconds before coming to Mass.
- ❖ **ARRIVE EARLY** Doors will open 15 minutes before Mass. Given the spacing requirement, those who come late may be asked to kindly return at another Mass time.
- ❖ **WEAR A FACE MASK** at all times while on the parish campus (both indoors and outside) and maintain **SAFE SOCIAL DISTANCING** (6 feet).
- ❖ Please enter using the front doors of the Church on Msgr. Owens Place or the bell tower door on St. Mary's Place (wheelchair accessible)
- ❖ HAND SANITIZER is available and must be used upon entering and exiting. We also encourage you to bring your own so that you may sanitize your hands while in your pew.
- ❖ You will be seated in marked pews to allow for social distancing in the Church.
- ❖ No physical contact during the Sign of Peace.

Distribution of Holy Communion

- ❖ At the time of Holy Communion, please remain seated until an usher directs you to come out of the pew. When directed process forward, keep a 6-foot distance from the person in front of you and keep your mask on.
- ❖ Holy Communion is permitted in the **HAND ONLY**.
- ❖ Once the consecrated host is placed in your hand, step to the side, and lift your mask to consume the Eucharist, then immediately reposition your mask and return to your seat.

After the Final Blessing

- ❖ **REMAIN IN YOUR PEW** until a minister or usher instructs you to move; exit the pew when prompted and proceed directly outside.
- ❖ No private prayer or gathering after Sunday Mass is permitted to allow for Church cleaning.
- ❖ Please do not congregate inside the Church
